Your Coach - About Adele Yunck

Adele started taking classes at the AADTC in 1985 with her first dog, little Australian Terrier Casey. She started teaching competition obedience at the AADTC in the late 1980's and started her school, Northfield Dog Training, in 1990, where she continues to teach numerous classes each week, from Puppy K through Utility. She has been teaching weekend seminars all around the country since the mid-1990s.

To date, Adele has titled five terriers and seven Flat-Coated Retrievers in obedience and numerous other dog sports, with eight of them earning the OTCH title, and has attended the AKC NOI/NOC with many dogs. She judged Novice obedience and Rally for several years and served on the 2007 AKC Obedience Advisory Committee.

Adele is the co-author of *Competition Obedience: A Balancing Act*, author of *The Art of Proofing*, *Musings on a Balancing Act*, and producer and author of the DVD and booklet set, *Totally Fetching: Teaching and Proofing a Reliable Retrieve*.

Workshop Specifics

While many seminars and classes focus on how to train our canine partners, there is a lot the human teammate should learn and practice to minimize losing points when competing.

In this workshop, Adele Yunck will cover footwork and handling for all levels of obedience, including:

- Footwork for heeling and pivots
- Leash handling for heeling and stays
- Throwing a dumbbell
- Hand and arm positions for all the obedience exercises
- Signals
- Common handler errors for all exercises
- And more

We will focus on the human part of the team, **so you won't be working with your dog.**

What You Should Bring - Handlers Only, No Dogs please!

TV Handlers should wear the shoes they typically train and trial in.

Bring leashes of different lengths, including a 6-foot leash if you have one.
